Boren Awards for International Study - National Security Education Program (NSEP)

Funds six months to one year of critical need foreign language and area studies in countries outside Western Europe, Canada, Australia and New Zealand. Eligibility: undergraduates; specific qualifications vary depending on country. ASU campus deadline: early January. http://www.borenawards.org (Fr, Soph, Jr, Sr)

Critical Language Scholarship: CLS is a fully-funded (airfare, room and board, tuition and activities) eight- to ten-week summer program that offers an intensive overseas language and cultural immersion program for American students. Students get the equivalent of a full year of college-level language study in one of 14 critical languages. Eligibility: undergraduates; specific qualifications vary depending on language.

Deadline: November 1st. http://www.clscholarship.org/ (Fr, Soph, Jr, Sr)

Doris Duke Conservation Scholars Program: The two-year program creates opportunities for Doris Duke scholars to study conservation issues, participate in land, water and wildlife research and intern with conservation projects at non-profits, research universities and government agencies nationwide. Eligibility: First- and second-year undergraduate students with a passion for conservation; US citizens or "dreamers" in any major. Deadline: early December/January. http://www.ddcf.org/what-we-fund/environment/ (Fr, Soph)

Fulbright Summer Institute Scholarship: Funds three-to six-week academic and cultural summer program to the UK. Participants get the opportunity to experience a highly regarded UK University, explore the culture, heritage and history of the UK and develop their academic ability by improving presentation, research and communication skills. Eligibility: Freshmen and sophomores only, 3.5+ GPA. Deadline: early February. http://www.fulbright.org.uk/fulbright-awards/exchanges-to-the-uk/undergraduates (Fr, Soph)

Gilman International Scholarship: This program supports students who have been traditionally underrepresented in study abroad, including students with high financial need (must receive a Pell Grant), first-generation college students, students from diverse ethnic backgrounds, students with disabilities, and students of non-traditional age or majors (STEM). 2,800 scholarships of up to \$5,000 awarded annually! Deadline: Summer/Fall is March 1st, Spring is Oct. 1st. http://www.iie.org/gilman (Fr, Soph, Jr, Sr)

Goldwater Scholarship: Two-year science, math or engineering (STEM) scholarship. Eligibility: full-time sophomore or junior; 3.8 GPA; supports future researchers; does not support intending medical school applicants. ASU campus deadline: December 1st. https://goldwater.scholarsapply.org/ (Soph, Jr)

Killam Fellowship (Fulbright Canada): Funding for a semester or academic year of study at any of the participating Canadian universities. Eligibility: U.S. citizenship; full-time undergraduate student; academic achievement. (Proficiency in French is required only if studying at Francophone universities).

ASU campus deadline: first week in January. www.killamfellowships.com (Soph, Jr, Sr)

Udall Scholarship: Supports students in environmental public policy, or for Native American students interested in health care or tribal policy. Provides \$7,000 per year scholarship and a four-day leadership retreat hosted by the Udall Foundation. ASU campus deadline: early February. http://www.udall.gov (Soph, Jr)

Public Policy & International Affairs (PPIA) Fellowship: Prepares undergraduates to be competitive candidates for top degree programs in the fields of public policy or international affairs. Accepted students participate in an intensive, 7-week academic program during the summer before their senior year at Princeton, Carnegie Mellon, UC Berkeley or the U of Michigan. Deadline: Nov. 1 http://www.ppiaprogram.org/ppia/ (Jr)



Truman Scholarship: Multi-year fellowship for a graduate degree in a public-service field. Funds \$30,000 to students who can be "change agents" and make a difference in government, education and other non-profit fields. Eligibility: full-time junior (occasionally seniors); 3.5 GPA; strong off-campus service record.

ASU campus deadline: mid-November. http://www.truman.gov (Jr)

Thomas R. Pickering Foreign Affairs Fellowship: Funded by the U.S. Department of State, this scholarship seeks highly motivated college juniors who wish to become Foreign Service Officers in the Department of State. Students with a GPA of 3.2 or higher, leadership potential and involvement in their community are encouraged to apply. Deadline: mid-January. http://www.woodrow.org (Jr, Sr)

Senior Year: Scholarships and Fellowships for after graduation

Rhodes Scholarship: Full support for two years at Oxford University in any discipline. Eligibility: full-time students between 18-24 years old; academic excellence; distinguished leadership in some endeavor; bachelor's degree before leaving. ASU campus deadline: early April. http://www.rhodesscholar.org

Marshall Scholarship: Full support for two years at any British university in any field. Eligibility: full-time students; academic excellence, proven leadership or other distinction. Minimum 3.7 GPA. Bachelor's degree before leaving. ASU campus deadline: early April. http://www.marshallscholarship.org

Mitchell Scholarship: Full funding for an academic year of post-graduate study in any field at a university in Ireland, including the 7 universities in the Republic of Ireland and the 2 in Northern Ireland. Eligibility: demonstrated record of intellectual distinction, extra-curricular activities, and a potential for leadership. ASU campus deadline: early April. http://www.us-irelandalliance.org/scholarships.html

Churchill Scholarship: Provides support for one year postgraduate degree in the sciences, engineering and mathematics at the University of Cambridge. Eligibility: Fulltime seniors 19-26 years old, Academic excellence. Deadline: October 15th. http://www.winstonchurchillfoundation.org/index.html

Gates Cambridge Scholarship: Offered to students in any major who would like to pursue a full-time post-graduate degree at the University of Cambridge. Established in 2000 by a donation of \$210 million from the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, the Gates Cambridge Scholarships are among the most prestigious international scholarships in the world. ASU campus deadline: mid-September. https://www.gatescambridge.org/

Schwarzman Scholars Program: Full support for a one-year Master's Degree in Public Policy, Economics or Business at Tsinghua University in China. Students will live and study together on the campus of Schwarzman College, a newly-built, state-of-the-art facility, where all classes will be taught in English. Schwarzman Scholars will also have the opportunity to pursue professional internships and benefit from the guidance of a senior mentor. ASU campus deadline: mid-August. http://schwarzmanscholars.org/program

Fulbright Grant: Full support for an academic year abroad to either conduct research or work as an English Teaching Assistant (ETA) in more than 70 countries. Eligibility: completed bachelor's degree before leaving. Graduating seniors may apply; also available to current graduate students and ASU alumni. ASU campus deadline: mid-September. http://www.fulbrightonline.org
